
ABOUT THE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN:

Cuyahoga County Public Library is rated the Number One library in the nation among libraries serving populations of 500,000 or more. Since the Library's inception, we have had an effective and efficient way to fund our services to 47 communities through 28 branches and an administrative building. After community involvement, due diligence and more than six years of planning, our Board of Trustees adopted a new long-term financial plan to include a comprehensive Facilities Master Plan and capital campaign.

The Facilities Master Plan consists of priority construction, relocation, consolidation and/or renovation projects totaling \$100 million. The Library has secured \$90 million to fund the Plan. The purpose of this campaign is to continue our tradition of excellence and innovation within the context of the 21st-century community. This is the first capital campaign and the largest single investment the Library has made in its 87-year history, and it demonstrates our strong commitment to maintaining excellent library service in our communities.



BENEFITS OF THE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN:

- Build new facilities that are much more energy efficient, cost-effective and accessible, saving Cuyahoga County Public Library \$4 million a year by reducing operating and maintenance costs.
- Reduce our dependence on state funding without adding to the local property tax burden.
- Focus operating dollars on **long-term viability and excellent customer service** rather than building maintenance and energy costs.
- Establish equity of service throughout our entire district.
- Increase capacity to meet a growing demand for our collection materials and services.

Eighty-seven years after our founding, Cuyahoga County Public Library's mission has remained firmly rooted in a commitment to exceptional library service. Our service model focuses on community impact, innovation and collaboration.

We are a key agency in supporting the educational and learning needs of EVERY person in Cuyahoga County. We are recognized locally, regionally and nationally as an innovator in library service and programs, and we consistently rank among the best and busiest library systems in America.

- We are rated the Number One library in America among libraries serving populations of 500,000 or more by Hennen's American Public Library Ratings. We are the only library in the nation to have earned the Number One rating four times – 2004, 2006, 2009 and 2010.
- We lead the nation in per capita circulation, customer visits, program attendance and computer use for a library system of our size.
- In 2010, our customers visited our branches more than 7.6 million times and borrowed more than 20 million items, making us the fifth busiest library system in America.
- Since 2003, our circulation of library materials has increased 70 percent and customer visits to our branches have increased 30 percent.
