

Sparsely attended national parks in the United States



Gates of the Arctic National Park

In 2008, more than 61 million people visited our country's 58 national parks. Great Smoky Mountains and Grand Canyon were the most popular, with 9 million and 4.4 million visitors, respectively, and Yellowstone, Yosemite, and Olympic each boasted more than 3 million tourists. If those staggering crowds are too much for you, there are a number of parks—some quite off the beaten path—with visitors numbering in the mere thousands. According to the National Park Service, the 10 national parks with the fewest visitors in 2008 were:

- 1. Kobuk Valley, Alaska, 1,565 visitors
- 2. National Park of American Samoa, 3,683
- 3. Lake Clark, Alaska, 6,802
- 4. Katmai, Alaska, 7,970
- 5. Gates of the Arctic, Alaska, 11,397
- 6. Isle Royale, Mich., 14,038
- 7. North Cascades, Wash., 18,725
- 8. Dry Tortugas, Fla., 63,947
- Wrangell-St. Elias, Alaska, 65,693
- 10. Great Basin, Nev., 69,235
