



# a Message from Our Executive Director



Greetings,

The Library Journal Index of Public Library Service (LJ Index) recently honored Cuyahoga County Public Library (CCPL) with the highest overall rating among America's large metropolitan libraries for the seventh year in a row. The LJ Index compares U.S. libraries with their peers based on five per capita measures: circulation of physical materials, circulation of digital materials, number of visitors, program attendance and public internet computer use. Among our peers, CCPL received the highest overall score in the nation and ranked first in per capita circulation and number of visitors.

The *U* Index ratings are significant, in part, because they're indicators of how well we're doing our job. The higher our per capita activity, the stronger the indication that we're delivering relevant materials, programs and services to our customers. They also help us paint a fuller picture of the value we provide as centers of community life.

But the numbers only tell part of our story. The biggest reason for the success of our library system is, and has always been, people.

It's the helpful librarians and friendly clerks who make our library system great. It's the people behind the scenes who do the important work of keeping our operations running smoothly; the members of our Foundation Board and Friends groups who raise money to help support our programs, and the volunteers who give their time to help prepare students for success in school and beyond. It's the commitment of our Board of Trustees and our staff to provide the highest level of library service to county residents.

What else sets our library apart? Our customers. It's your support that makes the work we do possible and your appreciation that motivates us to be the best. Together, we make Cuyahoga County Public Library great.
